We inform you that the Centre for Democracy and Human Rights (CEDEM) with the support of the US Embassy in Podgorica (INL Program) is organizing a training for representatives of judiciary in Montenegro on the topic of confiscation of the proceeds of crime, especially of organized crime and corruption. Our partner in the organization of the training is the Judicial Training Center of Montenegro.

The training is part of the project "Civil Society for the effective crime assets recovery" which aims to contribute to strengthening cooperation between civil society and judicial institutions in the country concerning the seizure and forfeiture of the proceeds of crime. The aim of the training is to encourage the exchange of knowledge and experience between the representatives of the judiciary in Montenegro and Serbia and to contribute to greater affirmation and implementation of crime assets recovery mechanisms.

Training is being held on 9 and 10 June in hotel Palas, Petrovac. Participants are representatives of higher courts in Podgorica and Bijelo Polje, Appellate Court of Montenegro, the Supreme Court of Montenegro, the Supreme Public Prosecutor's Office and the Special Prosecutor's Office.

Lecturers from Montenegro are: Ms Lidija VUKČEVIĆ, Special Prosecutor, Montenegro and Mr Boris SAVIĆ, president of the Supreme Court of Podgorica, as well as representatives from Serbia: Ms Silvija PANOVIĆ-ĐURIĆ, Independent Expert for Crime Assets Recovery, Ms Zorica STOJŠIĆ, First Deputy of the Republic Public Prosecutor of Serbia and Ms Biljana SINANOVIĆ, judge of the Supreme Court of Cassation of Serbia.
